A: National/IPA is a national purchasing cooperative that contracts with vendors to provide good and services to participating public agencies..

Q: What advantage does National/IPA afford to participants?

A: Most public sector buyers are required to follow a time-consuming bidding process for procurement. National/IPA allows these buyers to make compliant purchases without the inconvenience of bidding, while taking advantage of combined buying power and discounted pricing.

A lead government agency, Region 4 Educational Service Center, publicly solicits national vendors to particpate in a documented, formal bidding process. National/IPA awards contracts to successful applicants, and allows agencies to take advantage of combined buying power regardless of their size.

Q: What if a prospective customer is not a participant?

A: As long as they are an eligible entity (see above), they may easily register online at the National/IPA website to participate. Registration is free and there are no restrictions on the amount or size of an order.
